The **M**ulti-**A**gency **T**ribal **I**nfrastructure **C**ollaborative (MATIC) began as a collaboration of five (5) leading federal agencies and has grown to more than **20** *active* and *engaged* partner organizations.



# Who is MATIC?



**MATIC's primary objective** is to enhance and improve coordinated delivery of infrastructure programs and services to Arizona Tribes and Native American communities by:

*Building Collaborative relationships.      Fostering tribal partnerships.*

*Developing collective solutions to address tribal infrastructure issues.*

*Expanding coordinated delivery of resources to Native American Communities.*

## **MATIC's Goals:**

- Host annual Statewide Multi-Agency **Tribal Resource Forums.**
- Create/Maintain **"Sharing List"** of tribal infrastructure projects.
- **Mobilize collaborative resources** to assist tribal infrastructure projects
- Compile a comprehensive **Tribal Resources Matrix.**
- Develop **Tribal Infrastructure Inventory & Assessment Tool.**
- Facilitate meetings with **Funders, Training & Technical Assistance Providers** to enhance working relationships with tribes.

# Indian Housing Block Grant Eligible Activities

- Indian Housing Assistance:
  - Modernization for housing previously developed under the U.S. Housing Act of 1937 CAS (current assisted stock) units.
  - Operating and maintaining CAS units.
- Housing Development
- Housing Services
- Housing Management Services
- Crime Prevention & Safety
- Planning & Administration
- Model Activities





# Indian Community Development Block Grant (ICDBG)

Most Common Single-Purpose project activities include:

- Land Acquisition for new housing
- Housing Rehabilitation
- Public facilities and improvements  
(*Examples: Community Centers, Clinics,  
water/sewer/power lines infrastructure, etc.*)
- Homeownership Assistance
- Economic Development
- Microenterprise Programs





# Loan Guarantee Programs

## Title VI:

- IHBG recipients may finance eligible affordable housing activities with the assistance of the federal guarantee.
- The tribe or TDHE leverages IHBG funds by pledging future grant funds as security for the repayment of the guaranteed obligation.

## Section 184:

### Loan Guarantee Eligible Activities

- Construction of new housing, including manufactured housing affixed to a permanent foundation (1 to 4 units)
- Rehabilitation of existing housing
- Acquisition of existing housing
- Acquisition and rehabilitation of existing housing
- Refinancing existing higher rate home loans
